In Bundoora (Northern Metropolitan) (State Electoral Divisions), on the day of the Census, the methods of travel to work for employed people were Car, as driver 64.4%, Train 5.6% and Car, as passenger 4.2%. Other common responses were Train, car as driver 1.8% and Walked only 1.6%. On the day, 13.0% of employed people travelled to work on public transport and 68.8% by car (either as driver or as passenger).
